According to the Spectator, 'This week, in an operating theatre at the government's science facility at Porton Down, a small group of guinea-pig choral singers, some professional and some amateur, are taking part in experiments to measure what happens to those aerosols — droplets measuring five-thousandths of a millimetre or less — when they are emitted by the singing voice.

Similar experiments are going on in London, conducted by Declan Costello, a consultant surgeon specialising in the human voice who also happens to be a tenor in Polyphony and the Holst Singers. 'A lot is resting on these experiments,' he tells me. 'If the result is not what we want to hear... well, at least Public Health England can make a decision based on science. At the moment we have no real data. It's not a situation that has ever needed to be studied.' 'Meanwhile we are very
