More than 30,000 people in North Tyneside have had the first dose of the vaccine so far!

## I've had my first dose of the vaccine, does that mean I can go about life as normal?

In short, no. We do not yet know whether vaccination will stop you from catching and passing on the virus, but we do expect it to reduce this risk. **So, it is still important to follow the hands, face, space guidance to protect those around you. It is hoped that eventually when enough people have been vaccinated this will change.**



You are required to have two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine, up to 12 weeks apart. You will get a good level of protection from the first dose but will not get maximum protection until at least 7 to 14 days after your second dose of vaccine. No vaccine is completely effective; some people may still get COVID-19 despite having a vaccination, but this should lessen the severity of any infection.

It's fantastic news that so many people have had the first dose of their vaccine in North Tyneside. Thanks to all the hard work of healthcare workers & volunteers, we are on track to have vaccinated the top 4 priority groups by 15th February.
