recently announced that from August, double jabbed individuals will no longer need to self-isolate if they are identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19 (but will still be encouraged to take a PCR test, and then would have to isolate if they are positive).

The current 7-day infection rate in North Tyneside is 392 per 100,000 people. Please follow Public Health guidance and wash your hands, wear a face covering in crowded spaces and give others plenty of space. Get your jabs and test and self-isolate where required. We can keep each other safe

Due to the current levels of COVID-19 infection across the North East, the Government have announced that the twelve local authorities (including North Tyneside) will collectively become an Enhanced Response Area as part of a regional approach to control the spread of COVID-19.

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
