Vaccination is one of our best tools of protection against COVID-19, and latest studies show that COVID-19 infection rates are three times lower for double vaccinated people. If you haven't had your vaccine yet, please get it. From August 16, double jabbed individuals no longer need to self-isolate if they are identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19 (but are still encouraged to take a PCR test, and would have to isolate if they are positive).

The current 7-day infection rate in North Tyneside is down slightly at 350 per 100,000 and locally (Weetslade ward) it is down also to 245 per 100,000 people. Please follow Public Health guidance and wash your hands, wear a face cov-

ering in crowded spaces and give others plenty of space and fresh air. Get your jabs and test and self-isolate where required. **We can keep each other safe**
